I have been guiding school groups in the Blue Mountains for several years. I have a passion for colonial history and early Blue Mountains history specifically.

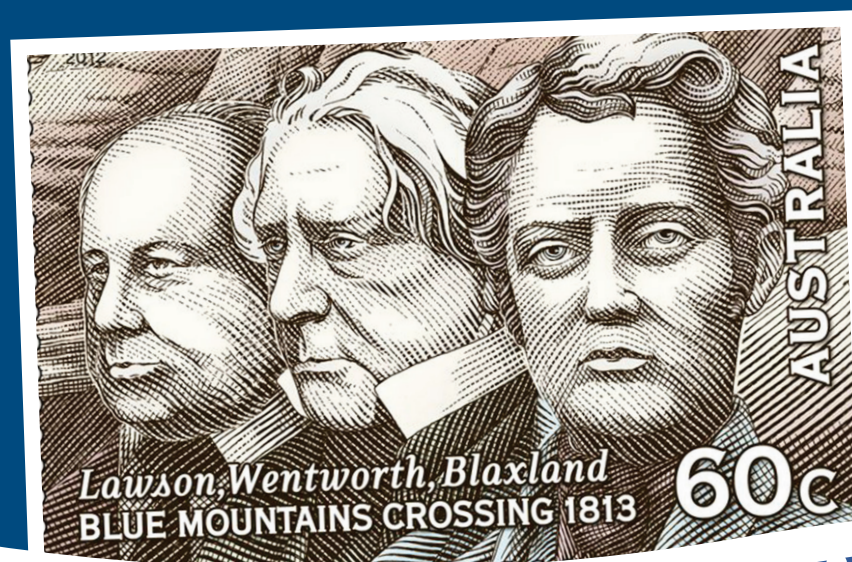
If your class is travelling through the Blue Mountains on a school camp or a day excursion, Mountains Tales can bring colonial history to life through storytelling and interactive activities.
